

## V\_Lists v1.0: The Manual

1. V\_Lists allows you to carry out some basic operations on word lists. Specifically, V\_Lists takes two word lists as input and reports the words which occur in only one of the lists, the words which occur in both of the lists and a cumulative list that contains words that appear in either of the original lists.

2. The V\_Lists work space contains two data slots. Copy your first word list into the first slot, and the second list into the second slot. The data should be formatted with one word to a line, as shown below.

3. Click the **SUBMIT** button to analyse your data.

4. V\_Lists generates a report that looks like the figure on the next page.

The report consists of four columns of data:

Column 1 lists the word types that appear in list 1 but not in list 2.

Column 2 lists the word types that appear in list 2 but not in list 1.

Column 3 lists the words which occur in both list 1 and in list 2.

Column 4 is a cumulative word list that contains the word types occurring either in list 1 or in list 2.

5. You can save the reports by copying and pasting the relevant columns into a new document.

6. Click the **RESET** button to return to the V\_Lists input page.
